Rector's Rambling

The birds have settled into their choral routine, and the dogs are lazing in the sun as I sit at the big stone picnic table to write this month's Rector's Rambling. Rebecca is working inside, trying to provide that last bit of motivation to her students as the end of the academic year approaches. Flowers surround me: geraniums, petunias, begonias, vinca, pansies, roses, impatiens, azaleas, rhododendron, and moss rose. There are small chili peppers on a couple of the bushes and a few Roma tomatoes about the size of my thumb. The grape vines are loaded this year, and the strawberries promise a good season as well. For lunch, I had a fresh salad of spinach, mixed lettuce, and herbs with raspberry vinegar for dressing. Last night, after finishing the pasture mowing and the last of the flower planting (at least for now), I ordered a set of 7 foot wooden oars for the jon boat with a new kind of oar locks which are supposed to smooth out and quiet my rowing (this year I hope to do away with the motor as much as possible and get some exercise.)

Everything should be good, but throughout the morning, I've had this gnawing sense of dissatisfaction which approaches, but never quite reaches discontent. I imagine that some of it is directly related to a discussion I had earlier this morning with a colleague. Some of it might also have to do with a sense of being manipulated because of my desire to help others. A bit of it might have to do with time of life grumpiness. But all of those explanations ultimately blame someone else or something which is beyond my control, and that really is unacceptable. The serenity of this place calls me to acknowledge the fact that I am the one who determines what bothers me and what I let threaten me, and what I let control me. Because you see, while I might not like the choices which seem to be readily available, I always have a choice, and faith calls me to rise above peevishness, and anger, and unreason, and blaming others for my issues and face the objective realities of life.

In First Corinthians, Saint Paul says that when he was a child, he thought as a child, but when he became an adult, he put away childish things. That is still good advice. All of us are sometimes tempted to act childishly, but by God's grace, he gives us the strength to rise above our childish propensities and act like the men and women he made us to be. Childish innocence and wonder are grand things, and show us the way to heaven, but there comes a time when we are called to cultivate those particular gifts and to put away the self-centered orientation and focus on the immediate which characterizes childhood. Only then do we model the way of Jesus Christ to our friends, family, and neighbors. Only then do we show forth the image and glory of God in a world so desperately in need of his transforming salvation. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

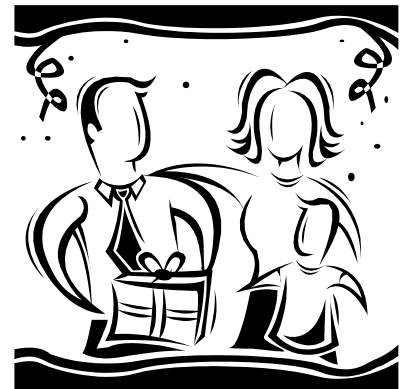
