## Rector's Rambling

Recently, I was reading in the book of Genesis and came across one of the most heart-rending, but most easily overlooked verses in the Bible. "Seeing that his father disliked Canaanite women, Esau went to Ishmael, and, in addition to his other wives, married Mahalath, sister of Nebaioth and daughter of Abraham's son Ishmael." (Gen. 28:8-9) Poor Esau. He wanted more than anything to please his dad. Dad liked to hunt, so he hunted. Dad liked game feasts, so he cooked. When his dad was dying, he set out to fulfill the old man's last wish, and while he was gone, his mother and pretty boy brother conspired to steal his blessing! Sure, he had done some dumb things, and had made some bad decisions over the years, but all he wanted was his father's approval. And now, as he watches his brother ride off to his promising future as the favored son and heir, Esau announced that he too will marry his cousin, which was allowed in those days. It was one final attempt to gain his parent's approval.

Do you ever feel like Esau? The approval you seek never seems to come. The mistakes you made seem unshakable. The shadow in which you walk never seems to go away. It really is the human experience for many of us, and for most of us at one time or another. The Bible is filled with examples of the reality that we call life. And then Jesus comes into the world. A woman about to be stoned by her neighbors is given the chance to live. A man who was born blind can see. People in the most dysfunctional and hopeless situations are given new outlooks and new lives. That is the real message of Christianity. "God so loved the world that he sent his only begotten son, that whoever believes in him should not perish, but find everlasting life!" As we believe and acknowledge Jesus as Lord, our situations may stay the same, but our reality changes as Jesus transforms those things that truly matter. It really is like a blind person having their sight restored. Light comes into the darkness~the light of God's love~and we are changed forever.
