Rector's Rambling

As Lent rolls on toward Holy Week and Easter, the Bible compels me to examine my own motives. Am I really seeking to cleanse my heart before God, or is my religion just a matter of going through the ceremonial motions. And as I move from the second chapter of Joel to Matthew six, the questions get even more disturbing. Do I "do religion" in order to make myself feel good about myself, and to gain the respect of others, or am I truly given over to God?

The keeping of "an holy and blessed Lent" cuts to the core of what makes me tick. It causes me to ask whether Ayn Rand and Friedrich Nietzsche, or even Sigmund Freud and Charles Darwin were really right about why I do the things I do. It embarrasses me to admit that there have been and sometimes are in my life times when the motives explored by the great secularist thinkers of our age are my own. But Lent gives me hope that there is another option, a better way. And so I pray with King David in Psalm 51, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

Cast me not away from your presence

And take not your Holy Spirit from me.

Give me the joy of your saving help again

And sustain me with your bountiful Spirit."

Lent is that time of honest self-examination which enables me to sense my need of God in a more profound and personal way. It is also a time of hope, because as I acknowledge my own inability, God pours his grace into my life and I am able to see the evidence of that positive transformation the Bible promises to everyone who believes. As we understand ourselves more profoundly, we experience his grace more completely, and step by step our motives come to reflect the motives of Jesus.

May this be a holy time for all of us, and may our transformation be so profound and noticeable that everyone we meet will be drawn to Jesus.

<u>Senior Wardens Wafflings – February 2018</u>

Firstly, I would like to extend a big thank you to Mark Conrad for his excellent service as the Senior Warden for the past three years. He certainly has left a big pair of shoes for me to fill. I would also like to thank you all for having faith in me to be your new Senior Warden, my commitment to you is very simple, I will do the best job I can to serve you and God. Please feel free to talk to me directly with any issues, comments or ideas you may have.

As I outlined at our recent annual parish meeting, the Vestry is going to be very busy this year, I have established 3 initiatives to be driven by the Vestry:

Appointment of a Transition Priest

The Diocesan Transition Minister is Cannon Lynn Carter-Edmands, she will be working very closely with the Vestry to help us find a transition Priest, then to help us find and appoint a full time Priest.

The transition and full time Priests will be the selection of St Johns along with St Paul's (Logan), the appointment of the Priests will need to be sanctioned by the Bishop.

The Wardens had an initial meeting with Canon Lynn in January and the full Vestry met with her in February.

Canon Lynn has laid out the general timeline for the appointment of a transition Priest and identified the steps needed to be taken by the Vestry.

The Vestry is at full speed with this process and is currently reviewing the Congregation Assessment Tools (CAT), that may be used to perform a Parish self analysis (with input from the congregation). This analysis will be used to identify critical success factors, and qualities required for both the transition and full time Priests.

The Vestry is committed to total transparency throughout this delicate and sensitive process. Progress at critical stages will be communicated via announcements at the Sunday church services, e-mails and in the Eagle & Lamb.

Vestry meetings are open, you are welcome to attend.

Long Term Parish Financial Stability

The Vestry will be establishing a committee to develop a strategy for the long term financial stability of the Parish, taking into consideration the ever increasing average age of the congregation, and the effects it may have in the future.

The initial step will be to establish the scope and objectives of the committee. Then to identify the correct people to represent a good cross section of our congregation to serve on the committee. If anyone is interested in serving on this committee, please let me know.

B.I.P. Initiative (Bums In Pews)

As previously mentioned, with our increasing average congregation age and lower attendance numbers, the Vestry will be creatively looking at ways to increase and maintain the congregation attendance numbers.

Deacon Nick and I have already met and have a number of ideas to promote St. Johns within the community. I am sure there are many more ideas to come from the Vestry and congregation members. I challenge you all to get your thinking caps on, and give your ideas to a Vestry member or myself, better still come along to the Vestry meetings and share your ideas with us.

Next Vestry meeting is March 11th (after coffee hour), I look forward to seeing you there!

Sincerely, Robin Leonard St. John's has supported Young Life since its inception in Lancaster. The following may answer questions regarding the organization.

YOUNG LIFE LANCASTER

Young Life is a 77-year-old, worldwide, interdenominational ministry whose mission is introducing adolescents to Jesus Christ and helping them grow in their faith. Young life is neither a church nor a substitute for church and is not affiliated with any denomination.

Young Life Lancaster (YLL) has been active since 2012. Under the guidance of Area Director Kelsey Bohl, thoroughly trained YLL volunteer leaders get to know kids by attending virtually every school extracurricular activity. By spending this time on kids' turf leaders *earn the right to be heard*. Once they have done so, they introduce kids to the Gospel and to Jesus Christ himself.

Club, which is an *event*, *not* an organization, is held Monday evenings during the school year at the Hanger on the grounds of Fairfield Christian Church. The Hanger – that's *Hanger*, as in "hanging out" - is made available to YLL at no cost. Often dubbed "controlled chaos," Club is characterized by lots of wholesome, goofy kid stuff, skits and plenty of *loud* music, followed, without fail, by a serious Bible message presented by one of the leaders. All high-school-age kids are invited and encouraged to participate in Club, as they are in all YLL activities.

Wednesday evenings throughout the year are the nights designated for Campaigners, a Bible study held at the home of a parent of one of the participating kids or of some other adult volunteer. Campaigners is for kids who want to deepen and strengthen their relationship with the Lord, in an environment in which they can comfortably raise questions and have them addressed candidly and thoroughly. A core function of Campaigners is to help students see *all* the kids in their school through the eyes of Jesus.

There are numerous other YLL events throughout the year, including Campaigner Weekend, Fall Weekend and summer Young Life Camp, which is commonly billed as "the best week of kids' lives." Club takes place every evening at every Young Life Camp throughout the world, and toward the end of the week many kids claim Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior!

You can learn more and get a better sense of the character of Young Life by googling an easily accessible, 8 minutes and 20 second Internet video entitled "In the World of Kids."

For essential financial support, YLL depends upon local churches, commercial and professional organizations and families and individuals.
